science and computer labs, setting up of 20 e-libraries (Nenasalas) funding contribution to the Ceylon Workers Education Trust that gives scholarships to children of estate workers every year. A project to create facilities for vocational training at Puttalam is under implementation. Another project to set up a Centre for English Language Training in Sri Lanka is in the pipeline.

Defence Cooperation

There is growing cooperation in this area, especially by way of exchange of visits and cooperation between the Navies. Indian Coast Guard extended assistance to Sri Lanka in containing oil spill off Galle in Sept 2006. India extends annual training slots to the Sri Lankan Armed Forces. In March 2008, Lt. Gen GSC Fonseka, Commander of the Sri Lankan Army, visited India.

Culture & Tourism Exchanges

Connectivity between the two countries is at an all time high with close to 120 flights per week including by private Indian airlines. Sri Lanka has the largest tourist arrivals from India. India also receives many Buddhist pilgrims from Sri Lanka every year.

Further, there are regular activities of the Indian Cultural Centre
